-Bird Identification is conducted by numerous amateur naturalists and professional ornithologist members of ASM.

-Audubon Society of Missouri has a of Cooperative Agreement with the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) to establish a web-based database to collect bird occurrence data at MDC Conservation Areas. The goal is to collect enough bird occurrence records to generate useful bird checklists for Conservation Areas. This Conservation Area Checklist Project is known as CACHE.

-Audubon Society of Missouri (ASM) has a Cooperative Agreement with the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) State Parks to establish a web-based database to collect bird occurrence data Missouri State Parks. The goal is to collect enough bird occurrence records to generate useful bird checklists for the parks. This State Parks Project is known as SPARKS.
